RSS (Really Simple Syndication) is a way of getting updates about information you're interested in without having to regularly visit a website(s). Instead, you use software that regularly checks news feeds and then sends you the updates you require by email. Using this software, you can subscribe to as many RSS news feeds on as many sites as you like.

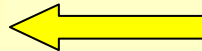


