#### **Progress to date**

- To date:
  - < 47 TEOs have successfully completed their April SDR [Status = Submitted].
  - < 28 TEOs have uploaded with zero errors and are ready to submit [Status = Processed].
  - < 69 TEOs have uploaded with errors to fix [Status = Rejected]
- Some teething issues have been raised. Most have been resolved or have workarounds.
- There are a couple that we are still working on.

# Known workarounds for the April SDR

#### **Upload files - leading zeros**

I need to make a change to the data in my upload file, but when I open the file I lose the leading zeros. I don't get the option to 'Don't Convert'

#### **Workaround:**

- 1. use excel to open the .CSV file.
- 2. Click 'Do Not Convert'.
- 3. If 'Do Not Convert' pop up doesn't appear, update your excel settings



#### SDR – unknown error

- There are different reasons for the unknown error, they include data errors, general data format (e.g. non numeric data for NSN) and timing out of submissions.
- Unknown errors often impact a single TEO e.g. where there is a data error


If you get an unknown error, contact CCG for escalation, investigation and resolution.



#### **SDR - Submit button**

I have completed and submitted my SDR but the Submit button still appears against my earlier processed submissions.

Advice: Your submission is complete, please do no click Submit on the earlier processed submissions.







#### Tuition Fee Paid by International Fee Paying Student – Error 736

- The validation rules for Error 736 are very complex
- We are taking this time to review and verify the rules
- There for April SDR we have changed Error 736 to a warning
- We will provide more information in preparation for August SDR

#### Error codes 143 – Iwi Affiliation is not valid

Data Classifications v1.2 on the website. The code must exist and be exactly the same. Up to six codes can be used.
