Purpose

- 1. This report asks you to:
 - **sign** a draft notice for the *New Zealand Gazette* (Appendix A) to establish a new council constitution for Toi Ohomai Institute of Technology (Toi Ohomai); and
 - **sign** the letter to the Chair of Toi Ohomai Institute of Technology (Appendix B) confirming that you have done so.

Background

- 2. Under recent amendments to the Education Act 1989 (the Act), if the council of an institution of technology or polytechnic (ITP) provides you with a new constitution, you establish the constitution by publishing a notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
- 3. As Minister, you do not have discretion to decline the new constitution provided that it complies with the legislation and is provided to you by 24 August 2019.
- 4. ITP constitutions have just three essential elements: name of the council, date the constitution comes into effect (which is 24 October 2019), and number of council members. No restriction exists on including additional information, and Toi Ohomai council has done so.

The new constitution increases the council size to allow for staff and student members

- 5. Amendments to the Act in 2018 (sections 222AA(1) and 222AD(4)) require the council to have between 8 and 10 members and to ensure that—
 - at least one member of the council is a permanent member of the teaching or general staff elected by the teaching and general staff to represent them; OR one member is an elected member of the permanent teaching staff and one member an elected member of the permanent general staff; and
 - at least one member is a student who is enrolled in the institution and whom the students of the institution have elected to represent them.
- 6. The TEC confirms that the draft constitution of Toi Ohomai is fully compliant with the legislation.

We need your authority to publish the new constitution

7. The new constitution will be established by your publishing a notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*. We recommend that you publish the constitution in the *New Zealand Gazette* as soon as practicable. As this is the first one, it can be used as a model by other ITP councils.

 - Appendix B, the letter to Ms Cathy Cooney, council Chair of Toi Ohomai, informing her the notice will be published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.
