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Purpose

 This report asks you to bring into effect amendments to the council constitution for Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi (Awanuiārangi) and notify the council Chair that you have done so.

Amendment to the constitution - context and background

- 2. The council/ Te Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi is seeking an amendment to their constitution in the context of the Ministry of Education's work-programme to address wānanga governance. Wānanga are seeking arrangements that better reflect the ethos, heritage and goals of the institutions. This amendment is an interim step while the Ministry works through the long term policy issues and options for governance.
- 3. Ngāti Awa have a pivotal role in creating and maintaining Awanuiārangi. The settlement of two Treaty claims¹, enabled Awanuiārangi to build a new campus on returned Tribal land. In recognition of this contribution, Ngāti Awa have a significant role in the governance of the wānanga and, under the council constitution, occupy six of the 12 seats on the governing council.
- 4. The council wishes to enable those council members to retain their seats for another four years, to allow time for new governance arrangements to be agreed and implemented. We recommend that the constitution is amended to provide the same maximum term to all council members.

The amendments increase the number of years a council member may serve

- 5. The revised constitution provides for increasing the number of terms that a council member may serve to the number that, for that person, allows them to serve for 20 years. The revision also allows any person who was a council member on the date of reconstitution in 2016 to remain until 31 May 2024 (whether they have served for 20 years or not).
- 6. Agreement to the present constitution was a "compromise solution" in the context of the 2015/16 reforms of university and wananga governance. The Minister at the time was seeking to limit the maximum number of terms that could be served across both subsectors to more closely align with the accepted standards of good governance.
- No upper limit exists in the legislation and this is an opportunity to better meet the special circumstances of wānanga governance. It would be in line with your decision on the Constitution of the Te Wānanga o Raukawa in December 2019.

The new constitution complies with the legislation

8. As Minister, you do not have discretion to decline the proposed changes to the constitution, provided that the amendments comply with the legislation. The TEC confirms that the new constitution complies with the Act. There are just four essentials,² and the new constitution reflects those requirements.

TEC recommends you publish the constitution

We recommend that you publish the constitution in the New Zealand Gazette as soon as
practicable. This would acknowledge that a mainstream model of governance is not necessarily
the right fit for wananga and demonstrate the Government's commitment to resolving the
governance issues.

Pursuant to section 170 of the Education Act 1989 ("Act"), the Minister for Tertiary Education, Skills and Employment hereby gives the following notice.

Notice

This notice may be cited as the Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi Constitution Notice 2020.

Preamble

The 2003 Deed of Settlement ("deed") between Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi and the Crown acknowledged and recorded the development of a partnership agreement setting out the principles to guide that relationship. The intention of the deed is to enhance the mutual commitment of a constructive future relationship between Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi and the Crown, in terms of Te Tiriti o Waitangi. It is on this basis that the constitution of the Council of Te Whare Wānanga o Awanuiārangi ("Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi") has been agreed.

Constitution

- 1. Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi shall be composed of up to a total of 12 members, consisting of:
 - a. four members appointed by the Minister; and
 - b. eight members appointed by Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi in accordance with its statutes established under section 171C of the Act.

2.

- a. Subject to clause 2(b), and in accordance with clause 1 of this notice and sections 171D and 173 of the Act, appointments to Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi shall be for not less than one year and not more than four years. The number of occasions on which a person may be appointed as a member of Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi is the number that, for that person, ensures that the total period for which they are a member does not exceed 20 years.
- b. Any person who is a member of Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi at the date of this notice may be appointed on the number of occasions provided for in clause 2(a) or the number of occasions which allows them to remain on Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi until 31 May 2024, whichever is the greater.
- 3. This constitution shall be established when notice is published in the New Zealand Gazette. The constitution will come into effect on 1 April 2020. This notice will replace the previous constitution established in the notice titled Te Mana Whakahaere o Awanuiārangi Constitution Notice 2016, as published in the New Zealand Gazette, 14 April 2016, No. 31.
