The NZ Marine and Composites transitional industry training organisation is winding down

- NZ Marine and Composites (NZMAC) was last recognised, and given effect, as an Industry Training Organisation on 1 May 2015. It became a Industry Training Organisation (TITO) when the Education and Training Act 2020 came into effect.
- 2. NZMAC TITO transitioned arranging training to a new private training establishment, MAST Academy (MAST), in August 2021. NZMAC TITO is completing the transition of its final standard setting responsibilities and formally handing over its standard setting responsibilities to Hanga-Aro Rau Workforce Development Council on 11 July 2022.

Minister may cancel the recognition of the TITO on request

- 3. NZMAC has written to you requesting that their recognition be cancelled (Appendix A).
- 4. The recognition of all TITOs will cease on 31 December 2023. However, as Minister of Education under clause 55(1)(a) of Schedule 1 of the Education and Training Act 2020, you can cancel the recognition of any TITO if you are asked to by the TITO.
- 5. NZMAC TITO is requesting early cancellation of its recognition so that the shareholding of MAST Academy can transfer promptly from the Marine Export Group to the Boating Industries Association. MAST Academy was established under the Marine Export Group Inc as at the time the Boating Industries Association was recognised as NZMAC TITO.
- 6. The TEC support the cancellation of recognition.
- 7. The cancellation of recognition of any TITO will take place once a notice is published in the *New Zealand Gazette*.

Next steps

- 8. If you agree to cancel the recognition of NZMAC TITO, we will publish a notice in the *New Zealand Gazette*, that will cancel the recognition and will take effect in July 2022.
- 9. A letter is attached for you to sign and send to Garry Lock, President of NZ Marine Industry Association advising them of the cancellation decision.
